Texas Legislature Continues Interim Hearings

Even with a slowed schedule over the summer, the Texas House and Senate continue holding interim hearings following the release of interim charges earlier this year.

We will continue monitoring these discussions and keep members updated as important issues develop.

Texas Supreme Court Issues Opinion in Family Dollar Stores of Texas v. JLMH Investments

The Supreme Court of Texas recently issued its opinion, and concurring and dissenting opinions, in [*Family Dollar Stores of Texas v. JLMH Investments*](#), a case in which TLMA participated by filing an amicus brief supporting the landowner position.

The Court ultimately ruled against JLMH Investments and reversed longstanding precedent regarding the availability of injunctive relief for certain nuisance claims.

While this was not the outcome TLMA advocated for, the decision raises important concerns for Texas landowners. The Court held that injunctive relief is not available when the underlying cause of action is no longer viable due to the statute of limitations.

The practical impact of this decision is still being evaluated. The ruling may create additional challenges for landowners dealing with property damage that develops gradually over time. Many issues begin as smaller problems and grow or change over the years, making it especially important for landowners to understand when damage first occurs and the importance of timely action.

The concurring opinions also recognize that questions remain about how the ruling will apply in future cases, and additional litigation may be needed to clarify certain issues.

TLMA will continue monitoring developments and will keep members informed.
