TEXAS PRODUCED WATER CONSORTIUM FILES LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The Texas Produced Water Consortium filed the first report to the Legislature.

Created by Senate Bill 601 by Chairman Charles Perry (R-Lubbock), the Consortium is responsible for producing a report that includes the following:

- suggested changes to laws and administrative rules to better enable beneficial uses of fluid oil and gas waste, including specific changes designed to find and define beneficial uses for fluid oil and gas waste outside of the oil and gas industry;
- 2. suggested guidance for establishing fluid oil and gas waste permitting and testing standards;
- a technologically and economically feasible pilot project for state participation in a facility designed and operated to recycle fluid oil and gas waste; and
- 4. an economic model for using fluid oil and gas waste in a way that is economical and efficient and that protects public health and the environment

Highlights of the report include a two-tier pilot project, request for state funding, and potential permitting changes necessary for the Railroad Commission and/or TCEQ to complete. The report proposes a two-tier pilot project. The first pilot project would commence immediately and focus on identifying the constituents in the produced water. The second would focus on testing technologies and their applicability to various end uses.

Notably, the report does not include the outstanding produced water ownership issue. Due to litigation and differing opinions of the Consortium members, it was decided that it was in the best interest to not include in this report, but rather continue discussions and address in subsequent reports.

Executive Director, Jennifer Bremer, served as the policy committee co-chair.

As you can see on the next page, there are a lot of events happening this fall! I hope that you will attend and watch as many as possible, but if not, we'll update you in the next newsletter.


