TEXAS SUPREME COURT ISSUES OPINION ALLOWING UTILITY EASEMENTS TO BE EXPANDED WITHOUT COMPENSATION

On February 28, 2020, the Texas Supreme Court issued its opinion in *Southwestern Electric Power Company v. Lynch* (No. 18-0768). At issue was whether a utility could unilaterally expand and widen a thirty foot easement to include a new larger project. The original easements that were acquired by an electric company in 1949, like many old easements in Texas, did not contain a specified width. SWEPCO argued that the easements should have no fixed width, giving them the right to use as much of the landowner's property as they ever require. The landowners, on the other hand, argued that the easements should be fixed at a thirty-foot width based on historic use by the utility. The lower courts ruled in favor of the landowners and limited the easements to thirty feet. SWEPCO appealed to avoid the holdings in favor of the landowners. Many associations in the agriculture and property rights industries filed an amicus brief informing the Court of the risks to Texas landowners. The utility industry also filed briefs urging the Court to reverse the lower courts. On Friday, the Texas Supreme Court sided with the utilities, reversing the lower courts, and held that the easements have no fixed width.

The Court reasoned that the fact that an easement lacks any fixed width does not render it ambiguous. As such, the courts cannot and should not consider historic use of the easement or other extrinsic evidence to read additional terms into a general easement. In other words, "[t]he use of a general easement without a fixed width is a strategic decision that does not render an easement ambiguous or require a court to supply the missing term." The recourse for landowners, in the opinion of the Court, is that the holder of a general easement must utilize the land in a reasonable manner and only to an extent that is reasonably necessary. If an easement holder exceeds this reasonableness standard, the Court explained that landowners can bring suit to enjoin the easement holder's use of the easements. This ruling creates a very concerning precedent for Texas landowners. Any landowner that is subject to an easement without a specified width is at risk of losing additional acreage to a pipeline, utility, or other easement holder.

MULTIPLE CASES & A RULEMAKING THAT IMPACT PROPERTY OWNERS

In addition to the *SWEPCO v. Lynch et. al* case mentioned on the cover of this newsletter, TLMA is following multiple Texas Supreme Court cases and Railroad Commission (RRC) rulemakings.

Most recently, the RRC approved rule amendments to Section 3.40 of the Texas Administrative Code. Currently, acreage cannot be assigned to multiple wells. This rule will allow acreage in unconventional fracture treated (UFT) fields. While TLMA is supportive overall of this change, we did file comments during both the informal and formal phases asking for unleased and leased mineral owners to receive the same notice.

TLMA is in the process of drafting an amicus brief in the *BPX Operating v. Strickhausen* case addressing the issue of whether or not cashing royalty payment check validates a pooling clause in your lease.

TLMA filed a brief in the *ConocoPhillips v. Ramirez* case defending the original intent of the division order statute and withholding payment for title disputes. The Court reversed the Court of Appeals decision. *Ramirez* is filing a motion for rehearing.

In June 2019, the Texas Supreme Court decided the *Barrow-Shaver v. Carrizo* farmout agreement case in favor of Carrizo. In August 2019, Barrow-Shaver filed a motion for rehearing in the case. TLMA filed a letter of support of the Court's decision and asked they not rehear the case. The Court denied the motion for rehearing.

In addition to the above cases, TLMA is monitoring the *Chesapeake v. Bell* Supreme Court case and *Hlavinka v. HSC Pipeline Partnership, LP* in the First Court of Appeals. The *Chesapeake* case is another offset well issue. The *Hlavinka* case is dealing with a properties highest and
